

Civil Peace Service – Peace and Conflict Assessment Invitation to submit an Offer for a Consultancy Contract

Brot für die Welt (Bread for the World - BftW) is looking for freelance consultants to work on a self-employed basis for the Civil Peace Service (CPS) Program in West Africa, covering the Republic of Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Liberia and Sierra Leone.

The contract shall start as soon as possible and end by the latest on 31 December 2020. The scope of the contract shall be 100 working days per total.

The CPS Program is jointly run with partner organisations in areas of crisis and conflict. Within this framework, Bread for the World promotes nonviolent conflict transformation by local partner organizations. The stakeholders involved in the project are the heads of partner organisations, seconded personnel (professionals) in the CPS programmes, National CPS Coordinators of the different country programs and the CPS team West Africa at Bread for the World head office in Berlin.

The Consultant shall be part of the CPS Support Team, which cooperates especially with National CPS Coordinators, who provide orientation and information to partner organizations and seconded CPS personnel, supporting them with methodological feedback and technical advice on how to design workshop programs, providing a learning environment for partner organizations and seconded personnel. The CPS Support Team shall consist of at least three consultants, each one focussing on one of the three following areas: Knowledge Management, Peace & Conflict Assessment, Mutual Learning & Training.

The focus of this assignment is Peace and Conflict Assessment aiming to enable local partners and National CPS Coordinators to analyse conflict and local capacities for peace by using methods and tools adjusted to the specific context. This principally includes the following tasks:

- Strengthen methodological skills for analysing socio-political conflict with local partners.
- Identify jointly local capacities for peace.
- Assist National CPS Coordinators to gain an understanding of already existing capacities of local partners for conflict transformation: n and their focus *on conflict* in their specific field of work.
- Identify and practice opportunities for joint conflict analysis with National CPS Coordinators, CPS partners and professionals (review jointly CPS country strategies during annual partners meeting, field visits to jointly identify peace needs of conflict parties)
- The assignment involves travel within CPS program countries and Germany.

Self-employed freelance consultants who are interested into this assignment are invited to submit their offers covering the following aspects and documents:

- 1. Cover letter indicating clearly the assignment to which the offer applies
- 2. A concept proposal (maximum 10 pages in total) covering the following aspects:
- an assessment of the political context of each of the program countries (see above)
- learning objectives of the assignment according to your judgement
- indicators on how to assess 'progress and monitor impact of your intervention,

- suggestions for the work within the different stakeholders (see above)
- suggestions for methods to apply in the work
- a proposal how you would schedule implementation of the assignment
- 3. Proof of professional qualification and work experience by submitting documents and/or reports on the following fields:
 - Background in the field of conflict transformation done by local civil society actors (including the churches) in the Global South,
 - Strong background and working experience with civil society actors especially in the respective CPS program countries is an asset (DR Congo, Cameroon, Liberia, Sierra Leone)
 - Relevant working experience with consulting of local partners in contexts of shrinking spaces.
 - Working experience in the field of knowledge management for non-profit organizations
 - Proven report writing and excellent verbal communication skills in French and English
 - High cultural sensitivity and competence in gender and diversity perspective
- 4. Price offer: The price offer shall consist of the honorarium per working day. The price must be stated in Euro currency.
